VA Caregiver Support Program (As of Oct. 1, 2022)

Veterans of all service eras are eligible to apply. There is a VA Caregiver Support Line (1-855-260-3274) for caregivers, family members, friends, veterans, and community partners to contact for information related to caregiving and available supports and services. It's a fairly large VA program. One segment is entitled "General Caregivers." This is a person who provides personal care services to a veteran enrolled in the VA health care who requires daily living assistance or supervision due to the result of a neurological impairment or injury. www.caregiver.va.gov

VA's Board of Veterans' Appeals

The VA's board of appeals provides two main types of appeals: 1) Filing a supplemental claim such as the veteran having some new evidence, or 2) The veteran doesn't agree with a previous VA decision and believes the VA made a mistake about their claim. The appeals board has added many new lawyers, however they still have a significant backlog to fulfill since all new employees have to undergo training. They continue to support a legacy appeals process as well as newer ones that are supposed to be faster. You can track your appeals online from the VA website: www.bva.va.gov.

The 2023 membership year has been completed, and we have exceeded our Department goal of 117 renewals, by getting 121 renewals for 2023. That is a tremendous accomplishment for our Post 1976 SAL Squadron!

MIA Update

The Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency announced three burial updates for service members who have been missing and unaccounted for from World War II and the Korean War. Returning home for burial with full military honors are:

- Army Pvt. 1st Class Charles A. Dickman, 17, of Cashton, Wisconsin, was a member of Mike Company, 21st Infantry Regiment, 24th Infantry Division. He went missing in action on July 12, 1950. The Army issued a presumptive finding of death on Dec. 13, 1953. He will be buried in his hometown on Oct. 21, 2023.
- Navy Seaman 2nd Class Stanley C. Galaszewski, 29, of Steubenville, Ohio, was assigned to the battleship USS California, which was moored at Ford Island, Pearl Harbor, when the ship was attacked by Japanese aircraft on Dec. 7, 1941, resulting in the death of 104 crewmen including Galaszewski. He will be buried in his hometown on Nov. 3, 2023.
- Army Air Forces 2nd Lt. Gilbert H. Myers, 27, of Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, was assigned to the 381st Bombardment Squadron, 310th Bombardment Group. He went missing in action on July 10, 1943. He will be buried in St. Petersburg, Florida, on Nov. 10, 2023.
