#### DISTRICT 17 FOUR CHAPLAINS MEMORIAL SERVICE

Join us! The District 17 Four Chaplains Memorial Service starts at 10:30 a.m. on Sunday, February 4th, 2024. The memorial service will be at the American Legion Post 177: 3939 Oak St. Fairfax, VA 22030.

Of the many thrilling incidents of World War II, probably none stirred the nation more deeply than the story of these four men of God whose heroic efforts were credited with the saving of more than 200 lives. These four—a Jewish Rabbi, a Roman Catholic Priest, and two Protestant Ministers-calmly issued life vests to American servicemen aboard the troop transport after it was torpedoed on February 3, 1943. When the supply of life preservers was exhausted, the four Chaplains removed their own life vests and gave them to four soldiers and then stood calmly on the sinking ship, their arms around one another's shoulders, and their heads bowed in prayer.



The memorial service includes a guest speaker and live music. Post 177 will provide food following the memorial service.
