Summer is in full swing—and it's hot out!

The 2024 membership year is over for SAL renewals. Our squadron had a total renewal count of 122 members for the 2024 membership year. That's under our 2024 Dept. goal of 128 members for our Post 1976 SAL squadron, though that was quite a jump from last year's Dept. goal of 117. So, we did a good job, and increased this year's membership by 5 members over last year. Any new members we pick up now will be applied to our 2025 membership drive, which we have now started. The renewal cost is still \$30 for SAL members. Dual members pay only the State Membership cost of \$15 for their dual SAL membership. You can place your renewal request in an envelope addressed to Mike T, with the \$30 renewal fee. The bartender on duty will provide the waiting renewals to me when I come into the post home for meetings or just to visit, which I will then process and provide a 2024 membership card for the member renewing; it will be mailed to you unless you are a frequent member that I can hand it to.

The post continues with the monthly Trivia Contests, on the third Tuesday of the month. American Legion Riders Report

It's hot outside now—time to get our bikes out and get on some rides!

As far as the events our chapter has been involved in, here are current efforts we have been or are scheduling to be involved in this Summer:

Several riders and supporters from our chapter were in the Virginia Legacy Run in June, which is a local run prior to the National American Legion Riders Legacy run. Our chapter started the VA Legacy Run in the Northern Region portion of this run. We rode out to Winchester, VA, on June 13, and joined a group of Northern Region VA riders on June 14 for a trip throughout the Northern VA area, arriving in Richmond that evening. June 15 consisted of several official functions in conjunction with the entire group of VA Legacy Run riders.

The first stop was at the VA Dept Riders Headquarters, where each chapter in the state gave out donations to the VA Legacy Run, whose donations are set up for providing scholarships for veterans' children. We provided the Post 1976 total contribution of \$2,500 (of which the Chapter 1976 Riders provided \$500 toward).

Next was a ride to the Virginia Capitol in Richmond, where the riders toured the Capitol.

The next stop was at the Virginia War Memorial, where we participated in the Vietnam Veterans Pinning Ceremony. It was reported that the total of donations collected in the VA Legacy Run was about \$108,000—which is a significant contribution to the National Legacy Run, which sets up the scholarships for veterans' children. We stayed in Richmond Saturday night and returned to Annandale Post on Sunday. It was a great ride.

Members of Chapter 1976 also rode out to Culpepper Post 330 on June 29 to celebrate at the Culpepper Post with bands all day and great food. It was a nice visit.

We will be looking into things to do at the Post as additional fundraisers. In addition, with this warm weather hanging around, let's set up some local rides and get out together on our bikes.
